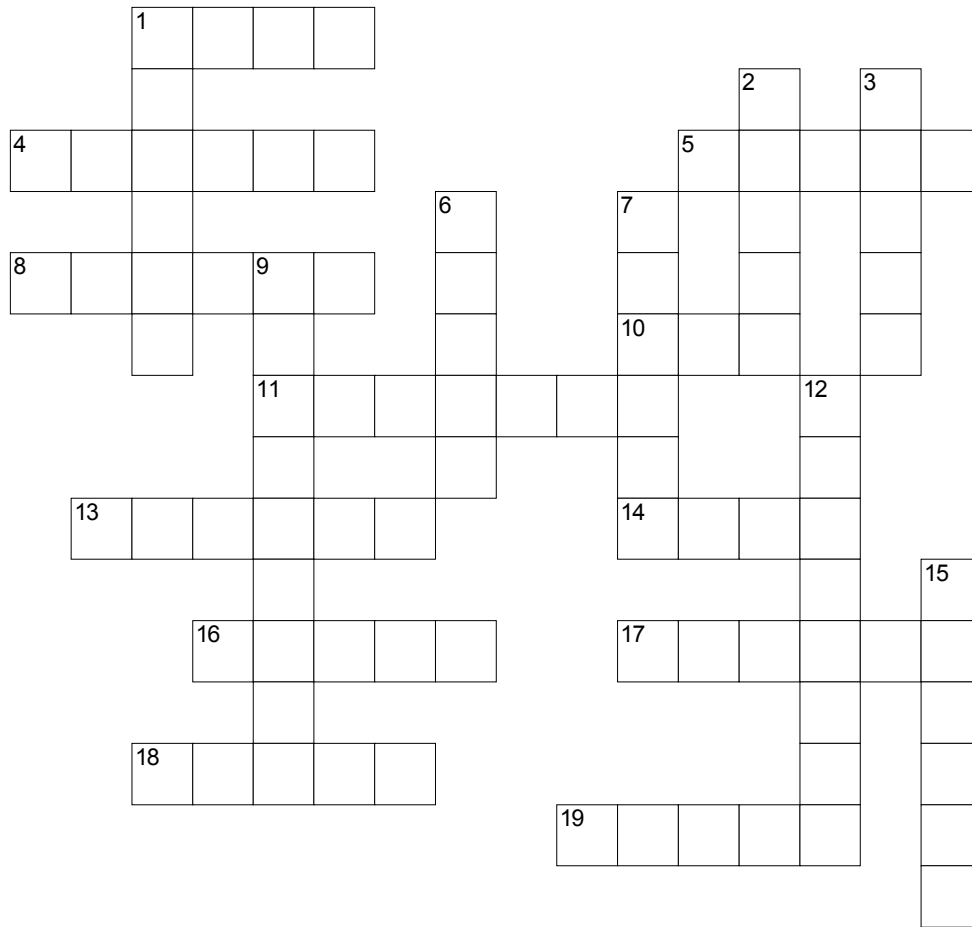

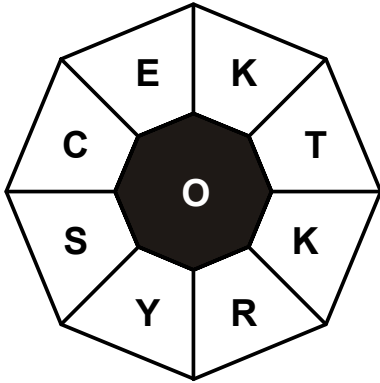
Unit 3-19 Polygon Answers

Some answers:

(With **O**): core, cork, cost, cosy, cot, rock, rocket, rocky, roe, rot, rote, score, **skyrocket**, sock, sore, sort, soy, store, storey, stork, story, toe, toy, yoke, (24)

(Others without **O**): cry, key, sky, sty (4)

Unit 3-19 Polygon Game



The above letters can be used to make a 9 letter mystery word (**it is not entirely a list word**) and other words. Mystery word clues: It is a compound word; the first part is a list word that has a long i sound; the second word has short vowel sounds; it can overcome the force of gravity. See the game rules and hints below.

Score: 6 words average, 8 good, 10 very good, 12 excellent. (28)

Use your dictionary to check or find words.

Rules:

Easier challenge: Using the given letters no more than once, make as many words as possible of **three** or more letters.

For a more difficult challenge: Use the given letters no more than once, make as many words as possible, of **three** or more letters, always including the central letter 'O'. Capitalised words (proper nouns), plurals, conjugated verbs (past tense e.g., 'hide' not 'hides'), adverbs ending in LY, comparatives and superlatives (adjectives e.g., safer, safest) are disallowed.

General rule:

Do not use acronyms (e.g., ABC), contractions, rude words or slang.

Hints for solving:

- Look for beginnings, such as UN- or SUB-, and endings, such as -ER or -ISM. Look for blends, such as ST, PR or ND.
- Write the letters in a different order; you may spot something different.
- Don't forget to look for words that begin with a vowel.
- When you find a word, try reading it backwards, to see if it suggests another word.
- When you find a word, try to find all the rearrangements of its letters that also form words.
- When you find a word, try substituting the remaining letters into it.
