

Some answers:

(With **A**): afar, area, bake, bare, bark, base, beak, bear, beat, brat, break, **breakfast**, breast, face, fake, fare, fast, fear, feast, feat, freak, race, rake, safe, seat, stake, stare, steak, take, tear (30)

(Others without A): best, rest, (2)

(Three letter words): are, ate, bat, ear, era, far, fat, rat, tar,

The above letters can be used to make a 9 letter mystery word (it is not entirely a list word) and other words. Mystery word clues: It is a compound word; the first part is a list word that has a silent 'a'; the two separate words do not relate to the meaning of the compound word; it is eaten before lunch. See the game rules and hints below.

Score: 8 words average, 10 good, 13 very good, 16 excellent. (32)

Use your dictionary to check or find words.

Rules:

Easier challenge: Using the given letters no more than once, make as many words as possible of **four** or more letters.

For a more difficult challenge: Use the given letters no more than once, make as many words as possible, of **four** or more letters, always including the central letter '**A**'. Capitalised words (proper nouns), plurals, conjugated verbs (past tense e.g., 'hide' not 'hides'), adverbs ending in LY, comparatives and superlatives (adjectives e.g., safer, safest) are disallowed.

General rule:

Do not use acronyms, contractions, rude words or slang.

Hints for solving:

- Look for beginnings, such as UN- or SUB-, and endings, such as -ER or -ISM. Look for blends, such as ST, PR or ND.
- Write the letters in a different order; you may spot something different.
- Don't forget to look for words that begin with a vowel.
- When you find a word, try reading it backwards, to see if it suggests another word.
- When you find a word, try to find all the rearrangements of its letters that also form words.
- When you find a word, try substituting the remaining letters into it.
