




# Unit 4-23 Polygon Answers

(With **S**): abseil, aisle, base, basil, bias, blasé, ease, easel, else, false, **feasible**, isle, lease, sable, safe, sail, sale, seal, seif, self, slab (21)

(Others without **S**): able, bail, bale, beef, fable, fail, feel, file, flab, flea, leaf, life

The above letters can be used to make an 8 letter mystery word (**it is not a list word**) and other words. Mystery word clues: It means 'possible' or 'able to be done' and starts with 'F'. See the game rules and hints below.

Use your dictionary to check or find words.

**Score:** 7 words average, 10 good, 13 very good, 16 excellent.

#### Rules:

**Easier challenge:** Using the given letters no more than once, make as many words as possible of **four** or more letters.

**For a more difficult challenge:** Use the given letters no more than once, make as many words as possible, of **four** or more letters, always including the central letter '**S**'. Capitalised words (proper nouns), plurals, conjugated verbs (past tense e.g., 'hide' not 'hides'), adverbs ending in LY, comparatives and superlatives (adjectives e.g., safer, safest) are disallowed.

#### General rule:

Do not use acronyms, contractions, rude words or slang.

# Hints for solving:

- Look for beginnings, such as UN- or SUB-, and endings, such as -ER or -ISM.
  Look for blends, such as ST, PR or ND.
- Write the letters in a different order; you may spot something different.
- Don't forget to look for words that begin with a vowel.
- When you find a word, try reading it backwards, to see if it suggests another word.
- When you find a word, try to find all the rearrangements of its letters that also form words.
- When you find a word, try substituting the remaining letters into it.
