




Unit 5-10 Polygon Answers

Some answers:

(With **T**): battle, beast, beat, belt, best, east, last, late, least, salt, seat, **seatbelt**, settle, sleet, stale, steal, steel, tale, tease, teat, test, (21)

(Others without T): able, bale, ease, lease, sale, seal (6)

Unit 5-10 Polygon Game



The above letters can be used to make a 8 letter mystery word (**it is not a list word**) and other words. Mystery word clues: It is a compound word; the first word has a long vowel sound; the second word has a short e sound; it is safety device in vehicles. See the game rules and hints below.

Score: 7 words average, 9 good, 12 very good, 15 excellent. (27)

Use your dictionary to check or find words.

Rules:

Easier challenge: Using the given letters no more than once, make as many words as possible of **four** or more letters.

For a more difficult challenge: Use the given letters no more than once, make as many words as possible, of **four** or more letters, always including the central letter '**T**'. Capitalised words (proper nouns), plurals, conjugated verbs (past tense e.g., 'hide' not 'hides'), adverbs ending in LY, comparatives and superlatives (adjectives e.g., safer, safest) are disallowed.

General rule:

Do not use acronyms, contractions, rude words or slang.

Hints for solving:

- Look for beginnings, such as UN- or SUB-, and endings, such as -ER or -ISM. Look for blends, such as ST, PR or ND.
- Write the letters in a different order; you may spot something different.
- Don't forget to look for words that begin with a vowel.
- When you find a word, try reading it backwards, to see if it suggests another word.
- When you find a word, try to find all the rearrangements of its letters that also form words.
- When you find a word, try substituting the remaining letters into it.
